ARMED AND INFORMED: What's happening NOW

In the weeks since the Legislature rammed through the most comprehensive package of anti-gun bills in California history, GOC has spent a lot of time networking, evaluating, strategizing and moving forward because yes – **there is work to be done and action to be taken**. With the swift exploits (last minute gut-and-amended bills) of both the Legislature and the Governor, the full fallout remains to be seen. That said, we want you to remain armed and informed, so below is a run-down of what passed, when the bills become effective and how it will impact your life as a gun owner.

*To complicate matters, the **Newsom Initiative (Proposition 63)** will still appear on the November ballot. While it is technically no longer necessary, Newsom is moving forward and working feverishly to exploit tragedy to sway voters to support restrictions on ammunition and gun ownership. However, Prop 63 will simply further disadvantage those who want to protect themselves, their homes and their loved ones.*

WHAT THE GOVERNOR **SIGNED**

SB 1235 (De Leon – D)

This is the most complex of the signed bills and will **supersede the chief components of Proposition 63**, the

so-called “Safety for All” initiative whether enacted by the voters or not:

- Becomes effective January 1, 2019.
- Ammunition will only be sold to a person listed in the Automated Firearms System.
- Requires the Department of Justice (DOJ) to maintain registration lists of buyers and sellers; beginning January 1, 2018, only a licensed ammunition vendor may sell ammunition.
- Revises the definition of “ammunition” to include all ammunition.
- Directs the DOJ to use the Prohibited Armed Persons File to cross-reference those who attempt to acquire ammunition.
- Makes it a crime for a person to provide ammunition to an individual they know or should know is not the actual purchaser; no exceptions or exemptions.
- Requires a resident bringing ammunition into the state to have it delivered to an ammunition dealer.
- Transactions of any ammunition, commencing on July 1, 2019, require the ammunition vendor to submit that information to the DOJ.
- Requires the DOJ to retain data for 2 years in an

“Ammunition Purchase Records File.”

SB 880 (Hall – D) and AB 1135 (Levine – D)

Both bills change the definition of an “assault weapon” to include any semi-automatic centerfire rifle that presently requires a “bullet button” in order to be legal. Any Californian that possessed one of these firearms within the time period of **January 1, 2001 to December 31, 2016** must register that weapon as a California assault weapon with the Department of Justice by **January 1, 2018**.

AB 857 (Cooper - D)

Requires one to obtain a DOJ generated **serial number** before the legal manufacture of a personal firearm; mirrors the language of SB 1407 (De Leon).

AB 1511 (Santiago – D)

Restricts loaning of a firearm to a spouse/domestic partner, parent, child, grandparent, or grandchild. Individual being loaned the gun must have a valid firearm safety certificate (FSC), and cannot be longer than 30 days. Effective **January 1, 2017**.

AB 1695 (Bonta – D)

Stipulates that any person who knowingly makes a false report of a lost or stolen firearm to law enforcement, is guilty of a misdemeanor. With such a misdemeanor conviction, an individual is prohibited from owning a firearm for **ten years**. Effective **January 1, 2017**.

SB 1446 (Hancock – D)

Outlaws possession of “large-capacity” magazines that hold more than 10 rounds; removes provision that “grandfathered” in those who owned such magazines prior to the initial ban, making all illegal and requires all to be removed from the state, sold to a licensed dealer, destroyed, or surrendered to law enforcement by **July 1, 2017**. Anyone still in possession on or after **July 1, 2017** will be charged with an infraction punishable by a fine, increasing by each subsequent offense.

WHAT THE GOVERNOR VETOED

AB 1673 (Gipson – D)

Required all unfinished receivers to be serial numbered and registered with the DOJ.

AB 1674 (Santiago – D)

Caps the number of firearms that may be purchased by a person at **one per month**.

AB 2607 (Ting – D)

Enabled an **employer, a coworker, a mental health worker, or an employee** of any high school or college to request the courts issue a **Gun Violence Restraining Order** against an individual from owning a gun.

WHAT'S STILL ADVANCING

The following bills are still **active**; the Legislature has until August 31 to pass these bills to the Governor’s desk, and he has until September 30 to sign or veto them:

AB 450 (McCarty – D) OPPOSE

Mandates the issuing authority to charge a fee which is “sufficient” to cover the cost of issuing and overseeing CCW permits.

AB 466 (McCarty – D)

Following a successful full-court press in opposition to CCW “good cause” requirements, the bill was amended to deal with a non-gun issue relative to tribal gaming.

AB 1664 (Levine – D) OPPOSE

Yet another “bullet button” ban (**near duplicates of AB 1135 Levine [D] and SB 880 Hall [D], both signed by Governor Brown.**)

AB 2510 (Linder – R) SUPPORT

Requires the DOJ to develop a **uniform license** that may be used as indicia of proof of licensure throughout the state. Will eliminate confusion between jurisdictions and protect CCW permittees.

SB 1332 (Mendoza – D) OPPOSE

Establishes onerous restrictions and regulations on the **loaning of firearms**.

SB 1407 (De Leon – D) OPPOSE

Requires one to obtain a DOJ generated **serial number** before the legal manufacture of a personal firearm. **This is a duplicate of AB 857 (Cooper-D), signed by Governor Brown.**

You might be wondering why members of the Legislature would continue to push bills that are virtual duplicates of what the Governor signed less than a month ago. Well, we do too - it makes no sense but we will not let unreasonable behavior keep us from continuing our opposition.

WHAT GOC IS DOING ABOUT IT

As we have said from the start, we have a skilled team of attorneys who are sorting through **every detail of each measure** – determining the smartest, most effective way to move forward. We know that being on the offensive line is far better than playing defensively – and retreating is never an option for GOC.

Many in the 2nd Amendment community have been caught off-guard by these recent developments – so we must be resolute in being **armed and informed**. It’s time to be fully engaged, because being asleep at the wheel is more dangerous than ever.

CALIFORNIA CANDIDATE SCORECARD GENERAL ELECTION NOVEMBER 8, 2016

Grades are based on a comprehensive questionnaire which was sent to each (non-incumbent) candidate that was certified by the Secretary of State. Incumbents are graded exclusively on their voting records. DNR indicates that a candidate did not respond to our questionnaire regarding their opinions on the importance of the 2nd Amendment. Incumbents are noted with an *. Those with a ** indicate an incumbent Assemblymember who is running for the Senate. Candidates noted in **RED** have been endorsed by Gun Owners of CA Campaign Committee.
