GENERAL ELECTION TICKET: WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

Without question, the race for <u>Governor</u> will be the most contentious and will have the greatest impact on our rights as gun owners in California. This is the big one, folks, which is why we need to pay special attention to the election in November. Statewide candidates who have the power to impact the 2nd Amendment are featured below.

In one corner GOVERNOR we have businessman John Cox, and across the ring is professional politician Gavin Newsom. The differences between the two men could not be more stark. John Cox has defended gun ownership and Gavin Newsom has ridiculed him for it. Newsom is privileged, entitled, and has pretty much made it a personal mission to dismantle the 2nd Amendment. His career has been bankrolled by one of the wealthiest families in America, and has been described as someone who is looking for "dramatic and disruptive change." This is downright frightening, so GOC is going to do everything in our power to let California voters know that he is a slick

leftist. Remember, **Newsom** is the author of 2016's Prop 63, which gave us the disastrous ammo and so-called "assault weapon" registration, plus the prohibition of standard capacity magazines that hold more than ten rounds. What's more, he has openly mocked "thoughts and prayers" in the aftermath of tragic shootings, has accused us of "moral cowardice" when it comes to stopping gun violence and has emphatically said "We are coming for your guns...."

This is a no brainer. Clear as glass. GOC has personally interviewed **John Cox** and we have been assured he will stand with us in defense of the 2nd Amendment. He has therefore earned our **endorsement**.

— LT. GOVERNOR —

The race for Lt. Governor is about a clear as mud. Democrat **Ed Hernandez** has served in both the Assembly and Senate, which earned him an **F from GOC** for consistently voting anti-gun. His opponent, **Eleni Kounalakis** is also a Democrat, and served as a delegate for Hillary Clinton, so it's not too hard to figure out where she stands on our issue. She's one of those liberals who wants to give everything away, but from what we can tell, she wants to take your gun rights.

— U.S. SENATE —

Another clear as mud choice comes from the race for U.S. Senate. Although GOC does not endorse in federal races (we are prohibited from doing so), we are still able to weigh in on some undisputed facts, because they both have stellar anti-gun voting records. In fact, both candidates have worked overtime trying to prove which one hates gun owners more: Is it LA State Senator Kevin de Leon (who has duked it out with Gavin Newsom on who is the baddest anti-gun guy out there) - - or is it fiveterm darling, incumbent Dianne (who turned in all her guns except that little one she used for her CCW) Feinstein? This is Democrat-on-Democrat war, and if their 2nd Amendment views weren't so criminal, it

would almost be fun to watch them scratch at each other. **De Leon's** anti-gun claim to fame is ushering "Gunmaggedon" through the legislative process and holding a rifle up before cameras, foolishly stating "This right here has the ability with a .30-caliber clip to disperse with 30 bullets within half a second. Thirty magazine clip in half a second." **Feinstein**, on the other hand, was the primary instigator of the original federal assault weapons ban. In a word, they are both determined 2A foes.

- ATTORNEY GENERAL -

With the exception of the Governor, the race for Attorney General is our most important opportunity to elect a solid, pro-gun candidate. GOC has enthusiastically endorsed Judge Steve Bailey – who is supremely dedicated to protecting our rights to keep and bear arms. He is facing pseudo-incumbent Xavier Becerra, who was appointed by Governor Jerry Brown to fill the seat of Kamala Harris, who was elected to replace Barbara Boxer in the U.S. Senate.

GOC has made numerous requests of **Bec**erra – and we have been met with nothing but crickets. We asked that he avoid issuing regulations that will impact millions of individuals at a time when there is little chance the public will be engaged, but he chose the path taken by his predecessor announcing new regulations on the eve of several major holidays. We asked that he not waste time and the state's money by going after people who serve no threat to those of us who live in the Golden State, but he decided a full-court anti-gun press was the right path, challenging pro-gun court rulings. We asked him to disclose a complete accounting of Dealer Record of Sale (DROS) funds - but that, too was ignored. Put simply, **Becerra** is an anti-gun duck – if it walks like one, and talks like one, the likelihood is that it is a duck.

Incumbent legislators are denoted with an * and have been graded exclusively on their voting records. GOC made some changes this year because we are no longer giving an A for simply voting right – to secure an A, a member must either introduce pro-gun legislation or rise and speak for the 2nd Amendment. Candidates are sent a comprehensive questionnaire that enables GOC to determine whether they support or oppose the 2nd Amendment. Those who did not respond are noted as DNR.

GOC will be happy to answer any questions about individual candidates; those who have been officially endorsed by Gun Owners of California Campaign Committee are listed in red.

2018 LEGISLATIVE UPDATE

The following is a list of the top priority bills GOC has been tracking; a more comprehensive list can be found at www.gunownersca.com under the tab "legislation."

The biggest win of the year was stopping LA Democrat Assemblyman Chris Holden's AB 3199 to ban gun raffles – designed specifically to destroy progun organizations' ability to raise money. Although dead for this year, we know this bill could raise its ugly head in 2019 – and we will be ready for it.

AB 986 (Gallagher/R) Support - DIED

Reduces fee for lifetime hunting/sport fishing licenses for honorably discharged veterans.

AB 3 (Bonta/D) Oppose - DIED

Prohibits the sale/transfer of firearms by a licensed dealer to those under 21.

AB 2103 (Gloria/D) Oppose - GOV's DESK

Extends course training for CCW to at least 8 hrs; mandates firing range exercise.

AB 2151 (Gray/D) Support - GOV's DESK

Makes available youth hunting tags for antelope, elk, bear, bighorn ram and wild pig.

AB 2382 (Gipson/D) Oppose - DIED

Requires "precursor" parts to be treated as firearms; mandated background check.

AB 2497 (Cooper/D) Oppose - DIED

Imposes a tax upon gun retailers to fund school counselors.

AB 3199 (Holden/D) Oppose - DIED

Prohibits firearm raffles.

SB 221 (Wiener/D) Oppose - GOV's DESK Prohibits guns shows at the Cow Palace

Prohibits guns shows at the Cow Palace.

SB 459 (Portantino/D) Oppose - DIED

Requires state retirement systems to adopt anti-gun investment policies.

SB 1100 (Portantino/D) Oppose - GOV's DESK

Prohibits sale of any gun to anyone under 21.

SB 1177 (Portantino/D) Oppose – GOV's DESK

Limits the purchase of any firearm to one per month.

SB 1346 (Jackson/D) Oppose - GOV's DESK

Makes definition of a multi-burst trigger activator to include bump fire stock.

SB 1382 (Vidak/R) Support – Signed by Governor

Permits the locking of a handgun in a tool/utility box that is affixed to a vehicle

SJR 24 – Jackson/D) Oppose - DIED

Asks Congress to reauthorize federal "assault weapons ban".


