

# GUN OWNERS of California

### **LEGISLATIVE UPDATE**

The 2019-2020 Legislative Session has come to a close and as is the norm, some nonsensical bills have made it to Governor Newsom's desk. Ultimately, when the gavel fell on August 31, we can say with certainty that it ended the way it began: an all-you-can-eat-buffet of liberal spending and a host of other Leftist garbage.

As we've reported, legislative havoc was wreaked this year by the coronavirus; testimony was thwarted, rules circumvented, hearings were limited and the normal biases against all things 2nd Amendment seemed particularly evident. Clogged phone lines, disconnected testimony and limited hearings are no way to run a government "of the people, by the people and for the people." When all was said and done, the following bills made it through the bungled process:

#### AB 2362: Muratsuchi/D

Allows DOJ to fine gun stores; places retailers in jeopardy of going out of business for minor paperwork violations.

#### **AB 2847:** Chiu/D

Forces manufacturers to use microstamping technology in order to have handguns on the California approved roster. Also, this bill *deletes* **three** models from the roster for every one "new" microstamped handgun.

#### SB 914: Portantino /D

This bill is a complex and convoluted mess that will seriously undermine youth shooting programs throughout

the state by mandating that only parents – not a relative, a school or legitimate shooting club – can provide a firearm to anyone under 18. This means that every competitive youth shooter – or kid that wants to go hunting with a grandparent – will not be able to use any firearm unless it's provided by the parents. This will literally gut high school shooting teams in the state.

GOC has communicated with Governor Newsom's office regarding our strong opposition to these bills and have thus requested his veto. The one silver lining of the COVID-19 shortened legislative session is that it forced the anti-gun legislators to focus on fewer bills. However, this hardly makes up for squelching voices throughout California that should have been heard.

#### **SB 1175:** Stern/D

We are pleased to report that some solid last minute legislative maneuvering by Senators Shannon Grove and Melissa Melendez, this bill was killed, which would have made it illegal to import or possess African species trophies (legal proof of possession required to be exempt). Regardless of whether an individual hunts out of the USA, we saw this as the camel's nose under the tent to eliminate hunting in the state.

#### **SB 118:**

This was the worst of 2020's anti-gun bills, and was signed by the Governor following passage of the Budget Bill. Deviously inserted in the 66 pages of the Senate's 2020 Public Safety Budget "trailer bill", the Legislature circumvented budget transparency with language that significantly expands the definition of assault weapons to

include "pifles" - firearms that are not rifles, shotguns or handguns (typically including firearms that do not have a shoulder stock). The bill also mandates a new statewide electronic system for the sale of firearm precursor parts that is similar to both the Dealer Record of Sales and the ammunition purchase approval systems. That means the DOJ has the authority to define what constitutes a firearm precursor part. The bill also limits the purchases of precursor parts to one every 30 days and accelerates the date of implementation from 2024 to July 1, 2022. A legal challenge is likely to follow. Stay tuned.

## FINALLY - GOOD NEWS FROM THE COURTS

GOC is proud to continue our role as "Friend of the Court Wrangler" and pleased to announce some good legal news, especially after being kicked in the gut by the U.S. Supreme Court when they recently rejected all gun-related lawsuits pending before them.

Just weeks ago, a panel from the 9th Circuit Court of Appeals issued a ruling in *Duncan v. Becerra* (GOC has participated by filing an amicus brief), upholding Judge Benitez's decision **striking down California's large-capacity magazine ban**. The court began with a statement that "The Second Amendment is a fundamental right rooted in both text and tradition."

The Court further found:

- that large-capacity magazines (LCMs) are protected by the Second Amendment.
- that LCMs are not unusual and are commonly used in lawful activity.
- that the prohibition is not pre sumptively lawful as a long

- standing regulation.
- there is no historical evidence that is persuasive that LCMs fall outside the scope of the Second Amendment's protection.

This is excellent news, although legal maneuvers are sure to follow from Attorney General Becerra, and there's been confusion regarding what can be legally purchased at this time.

In short, firearm retailers should continue to hold back from selling or shipping large cap magazines to California until the appeal is resolved or the stay is modified and or lifted, and consumers should refrain from purchasing such magazines online as well. This is different than "Freedom Week" of 2019 because Judge Benitez was forced to issue a "stay" on his own declaration that the law was unconstitutional and thus remains in place until the case is finally resolved.

We have just learned that Attorney General Becerra is appealing the ruling and has requested an en banc hearing, which means the case would be heard before the full 9th Circuit. We are once again in a position of waiting.

GOC also recently jumped into another high-profile legal fray by submitting an amicus brief in support Rhode v. Becerra, the case filed by gold medal Olympian Kim Rhode on the law requiring background checks and fees when exercising the right to purchase ammunition.

Once the Department of Justice officially launched ammo registration on July 1, 2019, GOC has been flooded with nightmare stories from throughout the state. Tens of thousands of erroneous denials have been reported yet the Department of Justice has repeatedly

bragged about how many criminals they have nabbed in the process – a minuscule number in the face of hundreds of thousands of applications.

The California Attorney General boasts that he stopped more than 750 "prohibited persons" in the first seven months, but this ignores that over 100,000 legitimate transactions by lawful individuals were prohibited from purchasing ammunition. The impact on the rights of the non-prohibited class is made worse when the 0.12% of transactions attempted by persons that the Department deemed to be statutorily "prohibited persons" are based on information that is admittedly flawed, outdated, inaccurate. This is a discriminatory and unconstitutional action and GOC stands ready to challenge the validity of the law.

### WE NEED YOU TO BE INFORMED – AND VOTE!

The 2020 election is fast approaching, amid choruses of the old cliché about this being the "most important election

in our lifetime." But this time, the evidence is impossible to ignore. If those on the Left catch any sort of tailwind on Tuesday, November 3, the three branches of government will be at risk and the stage set for all-out destruction of the 2nd Amendment.

It's long been said that telling an uninformed voter to vote is like giving a gun to someone who doesn't know how to shoot. It's dangerous. But we need YOU - the informed - to register to vote and make sure your fellow 2nd Amendment supporters do too. WHY? Because we have rock-solid proof that the gun community has made the difference between electing someone who is pro-gun and someone who is not. And, if you register to receive an absentee ballot, it makes for more efficient get-out-the-vote efforts. Of course, all over the country there are people from every party who cherish and respect the 2nd Amendment. The point remains, however, that at the federal level, there is a bold agenda by the Left to annihilate the right to keep and bear arms.
